

Activities for Business Schools and Institutions:

- 1. Procure Fairtrade labelled products for your gift hampers during events, fests, conferences/seminars.
- 2. Organize debates or seminars to introduce Fairtrade in your campus.
- 3. Fairtrade Tea/Coffee Corner set up by and for students.
- 4. Students' Union purchase Fairtrade Labelled merchandise for any business event hosted by/at the college. Any uniforms like a business suit or formal wear for presentation classes can be procured and making sure items sourced are Fairtrade where possible.
- 5. Conduct a Fundraising event (online or offline) to promote awareness of Fairtrade.
- 6. Develop interesting business simulation for senior grade school students to inculcate the importance of Trade in Agriculture in subjects like economics and commerce.
- 7. Case studies on Farmers can be included in the curriculum.
- 8. Inclusion of Fairtrade into your curriculum through courses such as Fair Trade and Microfinance; Entrepreneurship and Fair Trade; Fair Trade, Spirituality, and Social Justice or you can blend Fairtrade to your existing courses as per your best suited relevance.
- 9. Include Fairtrade as a theme/topic in research projects or term papers.



10.Develop and propose a Fairtrade Resolution and Fair Trade Procurement Policy for the University highlighting the impact that the procurement will create.
